Keep that in mind. And remember that the people you see and the places you go are also sacred because God is in them as well. Even if you are away, look to serve God. Continue to be the Church wherever you find yourself this summer. May you know God's presence in your work, in your rest, and in your play. May you have a happy, safe, relaxing summer.
