## From the Rector

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Now that Hilary has begun her new ministry at the Chapel of the Good Shepherd, several people have asked if St. John's will be hiring a new associate. Rest assured, the Vestry and I are working on it. I have been in conversation with the Diocese about the future of our staff, and there are several possibilities, all of which have different budget ramifications and are subject to available candidates. Two caveats are important. First, I will be on sabbatical from mid-May to early September of 2020, and St. John's will need clergy to cover that time. Secondly, the Diocese is creating a curacy program to train new clergy (curates are usually newly ordained clergy). They would like St. John's to host a new curate starting in July of 2020. St. John's would share the cost of that position with the Diocese, but the curate would serve as a full-time clergy person at St. John's.

For me, the perfect scenario would have St. John's hire a part-time interim associate rector beginning in January who would serve through September. That would allow the new curate to come in July, get acclimated, and begin her/his ministry before I return from sabbatical. The Vestry and I are working on a plan that would put some arrangement like this in next year's budget.

There are some other possible staff changes as well. You'll see below that we have recently hired an interim Children's Formation Director, Julie Peretin, to take on some of Hilary's responsibilities. In addition, Hilary and I have been lobbying for some time to hire a lay youth leader. While I love working with the youth and will continue to be a part of that ministry, I believe it could really take off with the help of a dedicated staff person (this is especially true now that we have an influx of middle school youth and now that Good Shepherd and St. John's are sharing a collaborative youth ministry). The Vestry and I are also working on a plan that would include a quarter-time youth leader position in next year's budget.

There are still a number of things being considered, some of which depend on next year's budget and upon finding the right people to join our staff. Because of your continued generosity and the good stewardship of our Vestry, we are in a good position financially to fill these positions. We are also very fortunate that St. John's is a wonderful parish and that greater Lafayette is a wonderful community. I expect that we will have no problem filling these positions with amazing people who will help our ministry flourish.

**Interim Children's Formation Director**

When Hilary left St. John's to begin her ministry at the Chapel of the Good Shepherd, we were left without a Children's Formation Director. To remedy that, and with the Vestry's approval, I have asked Julie Peretin to become the Interim Children's Formation Director to take care of some of Hilary's responsibilities. Julie will begin serving in this position immediately, working about five hours each week until the end of this school year (May 2020). She will be responsible for scheduling Godly Play and middle school teachers, organizing and preparing classrooms, and other related aspects of our children's formation program. Many of you already know Julie, her husband, Joe, and her children, Ezra, Elena and Esther. However, please welcome her to St. John's in this new role.

## November Book Group: *A Tree Grows in Brooklyn* by Betty Smith

7 p.m. Thursday, Nov. 21, St. John's Commons

In 2018, the 75th anniversary of its publication, *A Tree Grows in Brooklyn* was called “one of the greatest American novels” and “one of the books of the century.” This coming-of-age story from the turn of the century depicts Francie Nolan as a sensitive and idealistic girl whose Irish-American immigrant family faces many hardships in the slums of Williamsburg, a neighborhood of Brooklyn, New York. The story begins in 1912 when Francie is 11 years old and unfolds in a succession of episodes in her life. All the novel's themes of the problems that many immigrants face while trying to achieve the American dream — poverty, overcrowded schools, the importance of education in achieving success and the need to be loved — come together in the final chapters as Francie prepares to leave for college.

The novel caused a stir when published because of its frank portrayal of how the poor lived then in America. It endures, however, because we can see ourselves in Francie as she struggles and flourishes, like the Tree of Heaven that grows back through the concrete after being chopped down. We should also consider how the problems of women, immigrants, drug abuse and the poor have changed since then. — *Georgia Brist*, [gtbrist@gmail.com](mailto:gtbrist@gmail.com)

Two special music events will occur on All Saints' Sunday. At 4:30 p.m., **harpist Heaven Fan** and **guitarist Daniel Quinn** will perform a duo concert with music composed by Argentinian Maximo Pujol (b.1957) and American Gary Schocker (b.1959). Quinn hails from Fort Wayne and currently teaches at Saint Mary's and Holy Cross colleges in South Bend and at the University of Indianapolis.

Following the concert, the choir will sing Choral Evensong at 5 p.m. Music spanning many centuries will be sung from the pens of William Byrd, William Smith, Harold Friedell and H. Balfour Gardiner. We will be joined by organist Robert Richter of St. Christopher's Episcopal Church in Carmel. There will be a festive reception following Evensong. ### Vestry Notes

At the August meeting, the Vestry:

- Discussed the success of Worship in the Street, the “Never Again is Now” rally and the Brasilia pilgrimage.
- Discussed the advocacy committee kick-off brunch on Aug. 25 and the financial leadership meeting at Bradley’s house in Indianapolis to discuss our budget process.
- Discussed the various Sharing Ministry activities and programs taking place in the fall including Hunger Hike, Habitat for Humanity and Family Promise.
- Discussed hiring a quarter-time youth leader in 2020.
- Approved a recycling contract — St. John’s will now have on-site recycling pick-up.
- Approved adding gutters to the bell tower to deal with rust coming from the roof.
- Approves a request by the Greater Lafayette Immigrant Allies to host a film series at St. John’s.

At the September meeting, the Vestry:

- Discussed requests for the 2020 budget — each ministry committee or leader will receive a request for information about what they wish to include in the coming fiscal year.
- Discussed staffing — with Hilary’s appointment to the Chapel of the Good Shepherd, Bradley and the Vestry will continue discernment about how best to staff our ministries. The Diocese will assist us in recruiting an interim associate and would like St. John’s to host a curate (a newly ordained clergy person) beginning in July 2020. The Diocese would cover half of the cost of the curate position, but the curate would serve full time at St. John’s.
- Discussed the 2020 Annual Campaign/Stewardship Plan — In the past several years, the Stewardship Committee has hosted a “card party” to write cards to parishioners. Instead, we will have a brunch Nov. 3 where parishioners will be asked to pledge for 2020.
- Discussed the work of the Investment Task Force to answer a couple of questions about St. John’s endowments; specifically, whether St. John’s should invest in the Diocesan Special Fund or use our endowment funds in a different way to ease the budgeting process.
- Discussed the parish’s use of email communication.
- Accepted a proposal to purchase a new portable sound system.

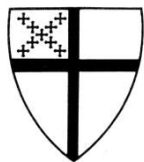
At the October meeting, the Vestry:

- Discussed the celebration from Hilary Cooke’s last Sunday.
- Discussed the Stewardship Committee’s plan and the newcomer’s event on Oct. 11.
- Approved a proposal from Bradley to hire an interim Children’s Formation Director. The position will be five hours per week at \$15 per hour beginning ASAP through May 2020.
- Discussed the recommendations of the Investment Task Force. The task force has yet to come to a consensus and will continue to gather information about moving our endowment to the Diocesan Special Fund. The task force is in favor of recommending that the Vestry take a distribution from the endowment each year for the budget rather than rely on income. This decision would allow us to better plan our budgets further in advance. The task force recommends considering this practice for 2021 and communicating with the congregation in the meantime.
- Approved a proposal to make a down-payment on a new security system with Mulhaupts to be installed in 2020.
- Approved a proposal to move remaining Food Pantry funds into the Operating Reserve as “Sharing Ministry Funds” and re-designated the Britt Food Pantry Fund as a restricted fund for “Sharing Ministries.”
