Updates from the Vestry: March meeting

At the March 11 meeting, the Vestry discussed the following items:

- The evolving coronavirus outbreak and St. John's response. Members discussed the possibility of canceling activities and services and creating pastoral care teams to follow up with parishioners while they are isolated.
- Updated policies for using endowment funds. These new policies would include a 3 percent cap on distribution; the "formula" for calculating that 3 percent figure would be based on a three-year rolling average of the market value; distribution in part or in whole on an as-needed basis; and direction that all income accumulated throughout the year be automatically reinvested.
- The Vestry approved the purchase of new internet equipment.

Kaitlin Curtice at St. John's

May 9 & 10

Author and speaker Kaitlin Curtice will speak at St. John's on May 9 and 10. As an enrolled member of the Potawatomi Citizen Band and someone who has grown up in the Christian faith, Kaitlin writes on the intersection of Indigenous spirituality, faith in everyday life and the Church. She is the author of the book *Glory Happening: Finding the Divine in Everyday Places* (2017) and *Native* (forthcoming in May 2020). She has contributed to OnBeing, Religion News Service, USA Today and Sojourners, among others.

Kaitlin will speak at St. John's at 7 p.m. Saturday, May 9, followed by a reception. She will also preach on Sunday, May 10, followed by a lunch in St. John's Commons.
